BEAR LAKE PRESERVATION ASSOCIATION ANNUAL MEETING SUNDAY, MAY 5, 2019 1:00PM

PRIOR TO THE START OF THE ANNUAL MEETING, TWO GUEST SPEAKERS MAKE PRESENTATIONS TO MEMBERS:

JASON BREEGGEMAN, EAST DISTRICT DNR FISHERIES BIOLOGIST: JASON PRESENTS A COMPREHENSIVE REPORT ON FISH AND THEIR HABITAT ON BEAR LAKE. HE RELATES A FISHERY ASSESSMENT IS COMPLETED EVERY EIGHT YEARS. THE DNR STUDIES SIZE, STRUCTURE, GENDER, AGE, WEIGHT AND GROWTH PATTERNS OF THE VARIOUS SPECIES FOUND IN THE LAKE. AS THE LAST SURVEY WAS 2002, THE NEXT WILL BE IN THE SPRING OF 2020. THE SURVEY IS COMPRIMISED OF FYKE NETTING, AND ELECTRO FISHING. AS SOON AS ICE IS OUT, FYKE NETTING WILL FOCUS ON NORTHERN PIKE AND WALLEYE. LATER IN SPRING, ELECTRO FISHING WILL CAPTURE BASS AND PAN FISH. NETS ARE CHECKED EVERY 24 HOURS. WE LOOK FORWARD TO THE 2020 SURVEY RESULTS, AND THE INFORMATION IT WILL PROVIDE.

JIM SCHARL, SENIOR BIOLOGIST-LAKE SERVICES MANAGER (WISCONSIN LAKE& POND RECLAMATION): AN EXTENSIVE WATER MANAGEMENT PLAN WAS COMPLETED ON BEAR LAKE IN 2002. AS LAKES CHANGE OVER TIME, LAKE STUDIES ARE DONE TO EXAMINE THE CONDITION OF THE LAKE AND SURROUNDING AREA'S. AQUATIC INVASIVE SPECIES ARE A DRIVING FORCE BEHIND LAKE STUDIES. INVASIVES CAN THE QUALITY OF THE LAKE, AND HARM EXSISTING PLANT AND FISH SPECIES. MANY SURROUNDING LAKES IN WAUPACA COUNTY HAVE HAD VARIOUS INVASIVES IN THEIR LAKES, WITH CONTROL ISSUES BEING DONE TO CONTROL THE INVADERS. WIS. LAKES & RESOURCE PROPOSES TO DO AN AQUATIC PLANT SURVEY USING 623 POTENTIAL SAMPLING POINTS ON BEAR LAKE, WITH RESULTS REPORTED BACK TO BLPA MEMBERS. THIS COMPANY CAN ALSO ASSIST WITH GRANT WRITING TO FUND FUTURE ISSUES.

A QUORUM WAS DETERMINED PRESENT WITH 25% OF MEMBERS IN ATTENDENCE. A MOTION TO APPROVE AGENDA BY JERRY ROEN, SECOND BY JON STANDRIDGE. MOTION CARRIED.

THE SECRETARY/TREASUER REPORTS WERE DISTRIBUTED PRIOR TO THE MEETING. WITH NO CORRECTIONS TO EITHER REPORT, A MOTION TO APPROVE BOTH REPORTS BY DUANE ABRAHAMSON, SECOND BY JERRY ROEN. MOTION CARRIED

OLD BUSINESS

CITIZEN LAKE MONITORING: THE 2018 SECCHI LAKE MONITORING REPORT WAS REVIEWED BY JUDY DOUD. THE MAIN CONCERN NOTED IS ALGAE GROWTH IN SPRING. BEAR LAKE CONTINUES TO BE A CLEAN, CLEAR LAKE.

NEWSLETTER: WENDY O'BRIEN UPDATES MEMBERS ON CURRENT STATUS OF BEAR LAKE WAVE. WE ARE FORTUNATE TO HAVE AMY MUELLER BE THE CONTENT COORDINATOR FOR THE NEWSLETTER. AS ALWAYS, MEMBERS ARE ENCOURAGED TO SUBMIT ARTICLES TO BE PUBLISHED.

NEW WEBSITE: MEMBERS SHOULD CHECK OUT NEW WEBSITE (bearlakewave.org). IT IS STILL A WORK IN PROGRESS, AND LIKE THE NEWSLETTER, WELCOME YOUR PICTURES AND IDEA'S FOR CONTENT.

ADOPT A HIGHWAY: RUSS HOLLMAN RELATES THIS ACTIVITY REMAINS FOR SPRING/FALL TRASH PICK UP. BLPA ALSO TAKES CARE OF TRASH COLLECTION AT BOAT LANDING.

INVASIVE SPECIES (PURPLE LOOSESTRIFE/JAPANESE KNOTWEED): MARY FURLONG UPDATES ON CURRENT STATUS OF INVASIVE PLANTS FOUND AROUND BEAR LAKE. THE BEETLES PLACED ON PLANTS IN THE PAST, STILL DO REAPPEAR IN THE SPRING, AND FEED ON PURPLE LOOSESTRIFE. SIGHTINGS OF LOOSESTRIFE HAS BEEN REDUCED, DUE IN PART TO PAST EFFORTS IN DISTRIBUTING PLANTS/BEETLES. JAPANESE KNOTWEED HAS ESTABLISHED IN AREA'S PREVIOUSLY TREATED BY THE SPIEGELBERG PROPERTY. GOLDEN SANDS RC&D WILL ASSIST BLPA IN EARLY AUGUST TO ERADICATE.

BOATLANDING UPDATE: RICK SCHROEDER RELATES BUMPERS HAVE BEEN PURCHASED FOR \$216.20. HE WILL BE PLACING ON DOCK SOON.

UPDATED LAKE STUDY: RICK SCHROEDER STATES AS LAST STUDY WAS 17 YEARS AGO; A NEW STUDY MAY BE IN ORDER. THE TOTAL COST OF STUDY WOULD BE \$14000.00, TO BE COMPLETED BY 2020. THE FIRST PHASE WOULD BE A SURVEY OF ALL PERSONS USING LAKE IN THE AMOUNT OF \$1300.00. MOST MEMBERS DID NOT FEEL THIS SURVEY WOULD BE OF LITTLE USE. THE STUDY OF 683 THROWS AROUND LAKE TO STUDY AQUATIC PLANTS, WOULD COST \$2895.00. AFTER DISUSSION ON GOING FORWARD WITH THE AQUATIC PLANT SURVEY, A MOTION BY DUANE ABRAHAMSON, SECOND BY NANCY STANDRIDGE TO SPEND \$2895.00 TO COMPLETE 1ST STEP OF AN AQUATIC PLANT SURVEY. DUANE ABRAHAMSON AND JERRY ROEN WISHED TO ADD IF THERE IS 200 LESS THROWS, PRICE WOULD BE REDUCED.ELECTION WITH THIS AMENDMENT ADDED, MOTION IS CARRIED.
